What's it about?

Understanding and Responding to Women Experiencing Domestic Abuse

This training aims to increase participants understanding of domestic abuse. It will help you to **Recognise** the signs of domestic abuse, **Respond** appropriately and **Refer** to the relevant services.

What will I learn?

This training will help to increase your:

- understanding of this major social issue
- awareness of the barriers facing women experiencing domestic abuse
- awareness of the complex dynamics in an abusive relationship
- knowledge of tactics used by perpetrators
- confidence in dealing with disclosure
- knowledge of the safety planning process
- knowledge of the services and supports available to women experiencing domestic abuse
- understanding of the referral process

Women who experience domestic abuse live in your local community. They use public services, they work across all sectors of our society and their children attend local schools. If you are involved in any of these areas you may meet women who need support.
